7. DISCUSSION ITEMS

- Tornado Warning Siren (Tri-State F.D.) 63rd Street & Plainfield Road
Deputy Chief Altobella advised the Committee of the replacement of the severe weather sirens located at 63rd Street and Western Avenue and Tri-State Fire Department's Station #2 located on Plainfield Road. There is a need to replace both sirens due to them not working properly and both are over 40 years old. The approximate cost to replace the siren at 63rd Street and Western Avenue is \$27,000.00. Chief Mancione of the Tri-State Fire Department advised that a shared cost between the Tri-State Fire Department and the Village of Willowbrook would be the worst case scenario with each paying approximately \$13,500.00 to replace the siren. There will be attempts to share the cost with Westmont, Darien and the DuPage County Sheriff to participate in this replacement, which would bring down the cost significantly to each agency.

The siren at the Tri-State Fire Department's Station #2, located on Plainfield Road, would

also need to be replaced with an attempt to share the replacement costs with Willowbrook, DuPage County Sheriff, Darien and the Tri-State Fire Department. Chief Mancione is also attempting to draft an Inter-Governmental Agreement for the sirens and an annual service agreement possibly with Braniff Communications to be shared as well at a cost of approximately \$750.00/each annually.

- Update – Probationary Patrol Officer
Deputy Chief Altobella advised the Committee that Officer Christine Danan is now riding on her own after completing the Field Training Program. Officers James Martino and Eric Babczak are currently riding with Field Training Officers after graduating from the Suburban Law Enforcement Academy on December 19th, 2014. Both officers passed their Illinois Law Enforcement Certification Examinations. All officers are doing very well.
