MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

WILLOWBROOK, DUPAGE COUNTY, ILLINOIS

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Cobb called the meeting to order at the hour of 7:08 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL

Those present at roll call were Chairman Richard Cobb, Commissioners Lorraine Grimsby, Ron Kanaverskis, Carol Lazarski, and Rob Pionke.

ABSENT: Commissioners Laurie Landsman, Rene Schuurman, and at time of Roll Call —
Commissioner Doug Stetina

Also present were Village Administrator Timothy Halik and Temporary Interim Superintendent of Parks and Recreation John Fenske.

A QUORUM WAS DECLARED

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES – MAY 3, 2016

The Commission reviewed the May 3, 2016 minutes.

MOTION: A Motion was made by Commissioner Grimsby and seconded by Commissioner Kanaverskis to approve the May 3, 2016 minutes as presented.

4. VISITOR'S BUSINESS

Ms. Barb Bozak, 6340 Americana Drive, Willowbrook, IL. Ms. Bozak advised that several residents from Lake Hinsdale Tower have been discussing the issues with Lake Hinsdale Park. The park is in a state of not being used due to playground equipment being removed. Suggestions were made about equipping the park with activities geared towards people with special needs.

***NOTE: Commissioner Stetina arrived at 7:11 p.m.

Chairman Cobb related that he has been meeting with Village staff about the park. Chairman Cobb stated that due to the suspension of grant funding, there has been a delay in completing any work at Willow Pond park and Lake Hinsdale park. Correspondence from the state has indicated that if any work is started, the

Village has the potential to lose any grant money. After discussion, the consensus of the Commission was to forfeit the \$60,000 grant for Lake Hinsdale park and begin renovations to include new playground equipment and possibly garden plots.

Administrator Halik advised that he will contact the consultant that drew up the Master Plan and have him come up with some proposals.

5. DISCUSSION – STATUS OF WILLOW POND PARK RENOVATION PROJECT (OSLAD GRANT)/LAKE HINSDALE PARK RENOVATION PROJECT

6. DISCUSSION – SPECIAL EVENT UPDATES/PLANNING

- a. Fishing Derby, Willow Pond Park – June 25, 2016

Interim Superintendent Fenske advised that flyers have been posted at the park, Indian Prairie Library, and Community Bank. As of today's date, there are three kids signed up for this event.

- b. Touch-A-Truck, Willow Commons Center – July 8, 2016

Interim Superintendent Fenske stated that so far, there are 15 confirmed vehicles for this event. Flyers are also posted at Community Bank, Borse Park, and the Gower website.

- c. Movie Night in the Park – July 15, 2016

Interim Superintendent Fenske advised that the movie this year will be The Minions. Chick-fil-A will be donating half the costs for the movie. Advertisement flyers for the movie will be at the restaurant on each table. Chick-fil-A will be passing out free food and drinks beginning at 7:30 p.m.

7. REPORT – WILLOWBROOK RESIDENT PARTICIPATION IN BURR RIDGE PARK DISTRICT PROGRAMS

Administrator Halik stated that he had spoken to the Burr Ridge Park District asking for an update on the status of the Intergovernmental Agreement. The agreement began in the Fall of 2015. The numbers have been increasing. A quarter to a third of all participants are Willowbrook residents.

8. COMMUNICATIONS

Interim Superintendent Fenske advised that he met with an Eagle Scout candidate that wishes to add artificial fish habitats to the pond at Prairie Trail. Interim Superintendent Fenske related that the other Eagle Scout project at Ridgemoor Park has been completed.

BACKGROUND

At the last Parks Commission meeting on June 7th, Commission members discussed the status of the Lake Hinsdale Park Renovation Project. In the Parks Master Plan, this particular park was originally intended to be converted to a passive recreational park with walking path, benches, etc. However, after the old playground equipment was removed from this park to start renovations, area residents asked that some playground equipment be included in the renovation plan. After further discussions, it was agreed that the newer playground equipment from Willow Pond Park would to be relocated to Lake Hinsdale Park, but since our parks grants have been suspended by the state, both projects are currently on hold. Concerned that the grant money will never be released by the state, area residents are now requesting that the Village move forward with a renovation of Lake Hinsdale Park.

In the interim, the majority of a list of identified maintenance items at Lake Hinsdale Park, compiled by Commissioner Kanaverskis, was completed on June 10th with the help of the DuPage Sherriff's Work Alternative Program (SWAP). Several of the identified maintenance items have not yet been completed, pending the agreed upon scope of the renovation project.

REQUEST FOR FEEDBACK

Staff contacted Tod Stanton from Design Perspectives to develop a revised conceptual design of Lake Hinsdale Park to include new playground equipment, community garden plots, and possibly a small shelter and benches. Mr. Stanton has provided the attached two (2) concept designs for consideration:

- **Concept A** – This concept includes a walking path, benches, existing and new playground equipment, and the components of the garden plot concept. (estimated construction cost: \$85,370)
- **Concept B** - This concept includes a walking path, benches, existing and new playground equipment, components of the garden plot concept, and a small shelter (estimated construction cost: \$92,625)

Mr. Stanton will attend the July 5th meeting to present both concept plans to the Commission and receive their feedback, so that a final design can be agreed upon. The desired number of garden plots should also be discussed, as there is additional space to add more plots. The target is to complete this project by fall.

Given various improvements will be handicapped accessible, some SRA funds could also be applied to this project. However, the final project cost, when including consulting services, will likely exceed the amount of available funding. Therefore, the project may need to be reduced in scope unless a request is made to the Village Board for additional funding.

Dear Tim,

It is a pleasure to have another opportunity to work with the Village in the near future. I have reviewed your email dated 6/10/16 about your upcoming park project at Lake Hinsdale.

SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUESTED:

I understand that the Village is seeking to redevelop the park space at Lake Hinsdale. The three primary design components identified in your email include;

- 1) **Playground Equipment** – Instead of moving the playground equipment from Willow Pond Park to this park, we intend to purchase new playground equipment and have it installed. The residents advised that they don't need too large of a playground, just enough pieces that their grandchildren can play on when they visit. There is already a merry-go-round and a swing there that we just re-painted and can stay. We had hoped to spend about \$20,000 to \$30,000 on a couple of playground components.
- 2) **Community Garden Plots** – The area residents have requested that we consider installing rentable individual garden plots in the area inside the walking path. The parks commission liked the concept, but we are largely unfamiliar with the design of community garden plots. Would this area (inside the walking path) be a viable location, and if so, how many could we fit there?
- 3) **Add a small shelter and benches.**

The final construction budget has not been set but it is possible to invest between \$50-\$75k for these 3 items.

Design Perspectives, Inc. has included the tasks below as professional services in our base fee.

BASE SCOPE OF SERVICES

A. Construction Documents

Design Perspectives will assemble a complete set of construction documents for the park project. Specific tasks include:

1. Prepare final site plan.
2. Finalize the graphic and written documentation that will be used to bid and construct the project.
3. Prepare Project Manual including front end documents.
4. Prepare Division 2 Technical Specifications as it relates to our scope of work.
5. Prepare cost estimate for construction work as it relates to our scope of work.
6. Prepare quantities of work for Bid Form as it relates to our scope of work.

Total Number of Meetings for this step: 1

B. Bidding Assistance (General Contractor)

1. Recommend reputable contractors for your consideration and fax Ad for Bid to interested parties.
2. Answer incidental contractor questions regarding the documents.
3. Issue written addenda for distribution to all bidders regarding clarifications or substantial changes of the bidding documents as approved by you.
4. Tabulation of bid results, review bids and provide recommendation for award.

Total Number of Meetings for this step: Up to 2

C. Construction Administration (General Contractor)

1. Conduct construction meetings to observe the work at intervals appropriate to the stage of construction. Not to exceed 2 visits.
2. Prepare owner approved change orders as requested.
3. Review contractor's application for payment.
4. Review contractor's project submittals.
5. Review the site for during construction milestones, substantial completion, prepare punch list and provide recommendation for final completion.

The proposal does not include any type of professional surveying or engineering services and associated costs will not be included in our base fee.

STAFF ASSIGNMENTS:

The staff assigned to work on this project has the unique qualifications to assist the Village of Willowbrook. Tod J. Stanton as well as Matt Adams & Christian Wilson will provide the consulting services for this effort.

FEES:

The scope below has been broken down with an hourly fee with an allowance of \$5,000.00 plus expenses for Tasks A-C. This approach will provide the Village with approximately 50 hours of consulting design services. Additional time can be billed beyond \$5,000 with written approval by the Village. The cost for additional sub-consultants such as engineers, surveyors, etc. will be paid directly by the Village.

BACKGROUND

At the last Parks Commission meeting on June 7th, Commission members discussed upgrading the landscaping of the Veteran’s Memorial located at Willow Pond Park. Suggestions included general maintenance of the improvements already there, additional mulching, and adding annuals to provide more color including possibly red poppies.

REQUEST FOR FEEDBACK

Staff contacted our local landscape consultant, Hinsdale Nurseries, and asked that the current Veteran’s Memorial site be evaluated and an improvement design be developed for the Commission’s consideration. Attached is a proposal received from Hinsdale Nurseries which includes their recommendations for landscape upgrades at the site. The scope of work includes a general clean-up of the area, re-shaping of the landscape bed, installation of new steel edging, placement of landscape fabric, crushed bluestone cover and extensive new landscape plantings. The plantings proposed are perennial plants, which are preferred, as opposed to annuals. With regard to the suggested red poppies, Hinsdale Nurseries shared that there are no perennial poppies that are red in color. To obtain the characteristic red poppies, they would need to be planted each year as annuals. Poppies are also not recommended for our planting area and tend to be expensive. Therefore, they are not part of the plan. Hinsdale Nurseries will also provide a rendering of the proposed landscape design, but it was not yet completed at the time the packets were distributed. Staff hopes to be able to share the rendering during the meeting on July 5th.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The Hinsdale Nurseries proposal includes labor and materials to complete the project for the cost of \$4,575. This could be expended from the following fund:

If the Commission would like to complete this project, but believes the cost is high, an alternative would be that we purchase all materials from Hinsdale Nurseries and use public works crews for labor to install. Since this is the Public Works Department’s busy season with road construction and tank painting projects currently underway, crews would need to schedule this project so it could be completed as time permits.

Blue Muffin is a dwarf cultivar of the native Arrowwood viburnum. Clusters of creamy-white flowers bloom in late spring. These will develop into bright blue fruits that are attractive to migratory birds. If fruit is desired, another cultivar (such as Chicago Lustre or Autumn Jazz) needs to be planted for cross-pollination. Glossy green leaves turn attractive shades of red, orange, and yellow in the fall. Blue Muffin is shade tolerant, although it will not be as dense as those in full sun or part shade.



Incrediball needs adequate moisture in full sun. It is not drought tolerant. It grows best in an area with morning sun and afternoon shade. A great shrub that makes a standout in the landscape.
