DECEMBER 2010

- November 29, 2010** At approximately 1628 an Officer spoke with the victim case number (10-17373) about Phone Harassment. The Officer contacted the Suspect by phone and advised the suspect to cease and desist any offensive activity/contact with the victim. On December 1, 2010 a call was made to the victim and the victim was very happy with the Officers actions and had a question we were able to answer. The victim will contact the Officer for follow up if needed. The victim will be contact the SA of both Will and DuPage Co about No Contact and/or Stalking Order.


