

## APRIL 2011

- April 6, 2011 At approximately 1057 hours Officers responded to 18 Lake View Court for the report of an IDENTITY THEFT (**Case # 11-02542**). The Complainant was contacted on Monday, April 11<sup>th</sup> at 1214 hours. The Complainant advised she was contacted by Det. Altobella regarding her case and advised she would like to leave a message to speak with him again. E-Mail message sent to Det. Altobella.

I told the victim I would send a e-mail to the R/O and Detective involved tonight April 14, 2011.
