JUNE 2011

- June 3, 2011 R/O responded to the station for a report of Phone Harassment (Case # 11-4112). The victim has received 50 to 60 calls both on her cell number and work number. When she called the number provided it appeared to be a SCAM. On June 9, 2011 a call was placed to the victim. The victim had not received any calls for 5 days. On today's date during our conversation the victim said the calls had started up again. She was happy with the R/O who took the report. I told the victim I would let the R/O know the calls had started again.
- June 3, 2011 R/O Arrived and spoke with the victim for a report of Theft under \$300.00 (Case # 11-4114). In summary the victim set her cell phone down to put an item in her shopping cart. When she went back the phone was missing. On June 15, 2011 a call was placed to the victim. I spoke to the father of the victim and he stated the cell phone had not been returned. He also stated the Officer did a good job taking the report. I left a message that if the victim had any question to contact the Officer involved.
- June 8, 2011 R/O responded to a report of Suspicious Circumstances (Case # 11-4252). It was reported that the victim heard her door knob being turned to try to open the door to her apartment. The Officer checked the building and did not find anything out of order except a storage locker without a lock. Only a few items were in the locker. A service report was left on the door of the apartment that the locker belonged too. This was unrelated to the original call. On June 15, 2011 a call was placed to the victim. The victim was very happy with the Officer and the search he conducted of the building. She re-assured by the Officer.
- June 12, 2011 R/O was dispatched to the Station for a report of Theft/Scam over \$300.00 (Case # 11-7374). The victims received a call from a person stating he was there grandson and he needed money wire to get him out of Jail after an accident. They wired the money to Canada (\$994.00 + Service fees of \$86.00). They later made contact with their grandson who stated he was not in any accident and was not in Canada. On June 15, 2011 a call was placed to the victims. They were happy with the Officer's explanation of how these things happen. The Officer did a good job for them and they understood that it would be very unlikely they would get the money returned.
- June 14, 2011 R/O was dispatched for a report of Criminal Damage to Property (Case # 11-4422). The victim stated the car was left in the driveway for about 1 hour and 15 minutes. During that time the passenger window was broken. The glass pattern made it appear that the glass was blow around and not where you would expect it to be. It was reported that the Landscape Company had been there to take care of the yard during that time. On June 20, 2011 a call was placed to the victim. She was happy with the Officer and the situation has been resolved. They found the person who was involved. No action needed at this time.

The key holder arrived and confirmed the visible missing items. They will review and provide the Police Department with any Video and an inventory of missing items. They will call for an update of the investigation.


