Is there additional decommissioning work being done?: Yes. On 12.18.19, the company SET Environmental, contracted by Sterigenics, will begin to clean out two ethylene glycol* tanks. The tank cleaning process will be completed by experienced SET Environmental technicians that are trained and certified in their field.

Why is it being done this way? Transporting requires tanks be emptied, cleaned and rinsed out. All wash water and solids will be contained in a reinforced tank attached to a truck cab. On completion, the truck driver tank hauler will be then driven out of our jurisdiction. All of the tanker contents will be properly disposed following leading industry standards.
